Gardeners grow their own food.

Each gardener rents their garden bed for the entire gardening season and owns all the produce in their garden bed.

Gardening season: April-October 31

Gardeners can begin planting as soon as the ground can be worked, but this is usually in the middle of April. We close out the garden Oct. 31.

COMMON GROUND

Sections of the garden marked "Common Ground" for registered gardeners to plant extra plants or produce to share with gardeners members.

Donations

Raised Bed Gardening

Gardeners produce about 2 pounds of produce from each square foot of garden bed, with some producing 3 pounds of food per square foot. That's 96-144 pounds of produce from one garden bed in a single season in a large garden bed! A small garden bed can grow 32-48 pounds of produce per garden bed.

Raised garden beds allow the gardeners to control the types of soil they use, conserve moisture, and produce large yields each season.

Garden beds are reserved based on registration.



Gardening Supplies Provided

Once a gardener registers and pays for their garden plot, they will have access to garden tools in the garden shed at the plot.

The City of Big Rapids also provides compost for Garden Members to amend the soil in their garden bed and wood chips for mulch.
